In his new book, **JESUS:** A **Pilgrimage** (HarperOne; Hardcover; March 2014)—25 years in the making, and, as Father Martin notes, "the result of a lifetime of passionate prayer, study, and work"—Martin recreates the world of first-century Galilee and Judea to usher readers into the life of Jesus. Painting a vivid picture of a man many still struggle to understand today, he addresses both Jesus's human emotions and his divine activities, allowing readers a unique and insightful look into the life of a man who experienced joy and sorrow, triumph and grief, as well as friendship and fear.
